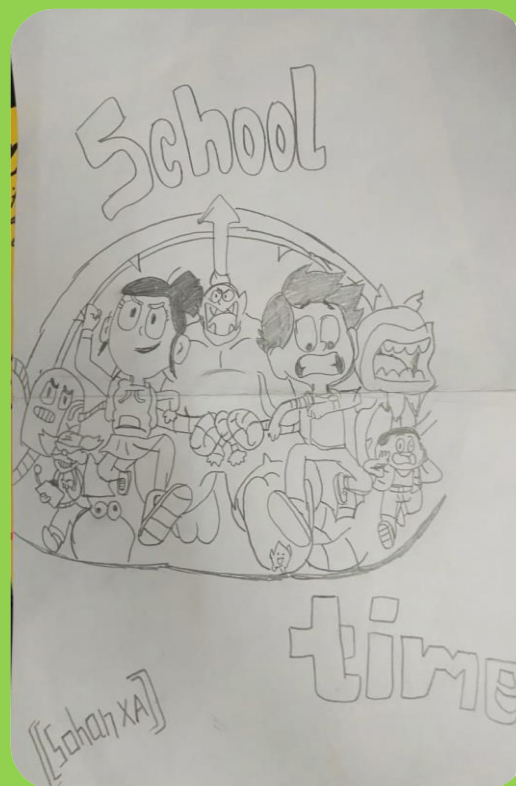
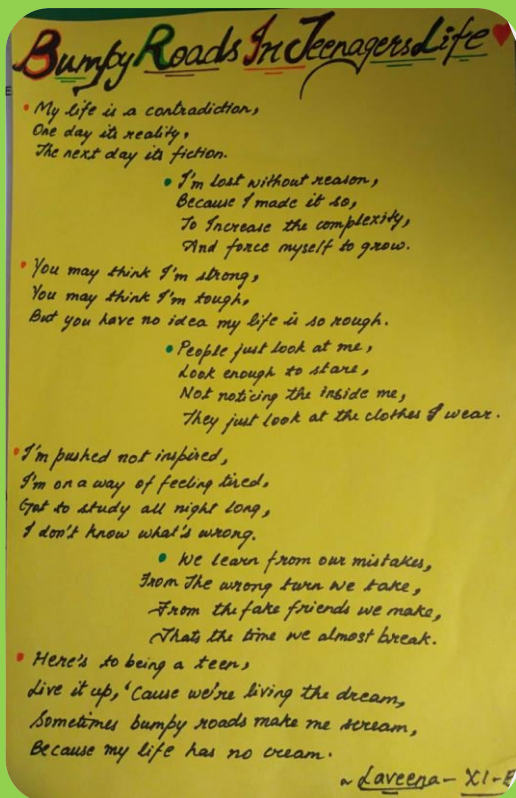
AS I WALK DOWN MY MEMORY
